COLLEGE OF GRADUATE STUDIES 2010-2011 Doctoral Research Fellowship Program For History Students

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Doctoral Research Fellowships in History are awarded on a competitive basis to students with outstanding academic records. Students who will be enrolled full-time in the doctoral degree program in history may apply for the award which provides a stipend and a tuition scholarship for up to 24 credit hours. The stipend is determined each year by the CMU Board of Trustees. The 2009-2010 stipend amount was \$12,600. NOTE: The tuition scholarship can only be used for courses on your doctoral degree program or ones approved by the student's graduate advisor.

ELIGIBILITY

Students who will be enrolled full-time in the history doctoral degree program are eligible to apply. Those who previously received a Doctoral Research Fellowship at CMU will not generally be granted a second award.

Recipients of Doctoral Research Fellowships must register for and complete at least nine graduate semester credit hours with a GPA of 3.00 or better each semester of the award.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

To apply, an applicant must submit the following:

1. an Application Packet for Admission to the College of Graduate Studies, including one copy of transcripts of all previous college course work, except that completed at CMU;
2. a completed Doctoral Research Fellowship application;

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications and all supporting materials must be submitted by **February 6, 2010**.

Applicants will be notified of the committee's decision by late March or April.
